Learning Aim A

Rules, regulations and Scoring Systems

You are allowed to use an old power point presentation BUT check it describes the points below.

1. Produce a two power point presentations, one on football and one on badminton, each one must include a description of the following:
 - What is the name of the game?
 - What is the aim of the game?
 - What is the duration of the game?
 - How do you start the game?
 - How do you score the game?
 - What playing surfaces can the game be played on?
 - What equipment is needed to play the game?
 - What health and safety points do you need to consider when playing the game?
 - How many players are allowed to play/be part of a team?
 - What are the dimensions of the playing area?
 - What are the specific rules related to the game? (At least 10).

Scenarios for Football and Badminton

1. Write a description of the action that you would take if this scenario occurred in a game / match you were officiating.

e.g. d) As the main referee of the game I would look towards the linesman to confirm the ball had gone out, when the flag goes up I would blow the whistle to stop play. I would then award the opposite team a throw in at or near to where the ball went out.

FOOTBALL

- a) If the defending team knocked the ball off the goal line after a shot at goal.
- b) A player slide tackles and takes out a player's legs in order to stop him getting the ball.
- c) If the goal keeper picks the ball up outside the penalty box.
- d) If the ball goes off the side line.

BADMINTON

- a) If a player serves and the shuttle cock over the net but short of the white service line on the opposite side.
- b) If a player touches the net with their racket when playing a net shot.
- c) A player hits the shuttle cock twice on their side of the court.
- d) If the game does not finish with two clear points.

Technical demands of Football and Badminton

2. Finish your annotated diagrams of the tactics needed for football. Creating space, dummy runs and formations. Describe how you do the tactic.
3. Finish your annotated diagrams of the skills needed for badminton. Basic grip, low serve, overhead clear, drop shot, smash and net shot. Describe how you do the skill.
4. Finish your annotated diagrams of the tactics needed for badminton. Deception, defending and attacking, decision making and moving a player around the court. Describe how you do the tactic.
